## **A) Award Types; Clearwater Secondary School Awards Selection Committee**

### **Scholarship**

The term **scholarship** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. Recipients are normally chosen on the basis of their **academic achievement**; however, other factors may include specific criteria as set out by the donor such as program of study, location of university or college and type or number of completed courses used in the calculation of the student's academic average. Applicants must be aware that these factors vary from donor to donor and award to award and that donors reserve the right to set their criteria as they see fit. *In many cases, donors consider factors such as the student's community involvement and volunteer or service activities as well as their academic achievement.* Normally, the criteria is specifically stated in advance under the description of the award. The amount of the award may also vary from year to year depending on the donor's financial situation.

Those scholarships whose recipients are selected by the donor are identified in the descriptions. The Clearwater Secondary School Award Selection Committee does not involve itself in the selection of the recipients of these donor-selected awards.

### **Bursary**

A **bursary** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. The demonstrated **financial need** of the applicant is a significant factor in the selection of the recipient. *As with scholarships, other factors may include academic achievement, career goals, extra-curricular involvement and service to the community.* In applying for these awards, applicants should include how they have fulfilled the specific criteria for eligibility. *In some cases, applicants are required to demonstrate their financial need by disclosing their household income and occupation of their parents/caregivers.* This information is treated as sensitive and confidential.

Those bursaries whose recipients are selected by the donor are identified in the descriptions. The Clearwater Secondary School Award Selection Committee does not involve itself in the selection of the recipients of these donor-selected awards.

### **Clearwater Secondary School Awards Selection Committee**

The **Clearwater Secondary School Awards Selection Committee** is chaired by the School Counsellor and is comprised of the School Principal and/or Vice-Principal, a community representative who is normally the current or a past School District Trustee for Clearwater, and/or a Teacher Representative. This committee reviews applications for scholarships and bursaries that are not selected by donors and selects recipients on behalf of donors.

## **B) Average Percentage Mark**

For the purposes of selecting award recipients, the Clearwater Secondary School Awards Selection Committee will use the following **formula** to determine the academic standing of applicants. The **average percentage mark** is based on

- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the five required courses in grades 11 and 12** (Language Arts 11, Mathematics 11, Social Studies 11 or First Nations Studies 12, (the top) Science 11, and Language Arts 12)  
**plus**
- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the applicant's top three grade 12 numbered courses.**

**Note:** Please highlight (not underline) these eight courses and their classroom (excluding provincial exams) marks on your transcript and/or third term report card.

**Note:** The completion of Essentials Mathematics and Communications courses will not exclude a student from being eligible for awards. Some school awards are inclusive in nature and donors encourage all students to apply for them.

**Note:** It is difficult to identify courses as academic and non-academic. For this reason, the Clearwater Secondary School Awards Selection Committee will consider all grade 12 courses equally. It is in the best interest of the student to complete as many grade 12 courses as possible in order to augment his or average percentage mark.

- For the purpose of determining the **average percentage mark, the following courses will not be considered:** Work Experience 12A or 12B, Secondary School Apprenticeship 12A or 12B, Teacher Assistant 12, Independent Directed Study 12, or Learning Strategies 12.
- Marks from regular courses taken second semester *may* be counted toward your average percentage mark. A copy of your third term report card must be submitted and the course and mark highlighted.
- Distributed Learning courses (@KOOL, SCIDES) must be at least three-quarters completed (75+ percent) by the end of the third term to be considered in the average percentage mark. A copy of your third term report card from @KOOL must be submitted and the course and mark highlighted.
- TRU>Start Open Learning dual credit courses must be fully-completed and have been assigned a final mark by the time of application to be considered in the average percentage mark. Highlight course and mark on transcript.

**Note:** The eight courses used to determine the average percentage mark **constitute the minimum level of course work necessary** in order for students to be considered for scholarships or bursaries in a given year. The percentages of these eight courses will be added together and divided by eight to establish an **average percentage mark**. This average percentage mark shall be used to rank all applicants in order to determine the top academic students from Clearwater Secondary School.

## **C) Provincial and District Scholarship and Bursary Awards**

### **Grade 12 Graduation Program Examinations Scholarships (Provincial Scholarship Program)**

The Grade 12 Graduation Program Examinations Scholarships program rewards graduating students for academic excellence in their Grade 12 provincial examinations. These \$1000 awards and \$2500 (to the top 20 students only) awards can be redeemed when a student enters a designated post-secondary institution. A **Grade 12 Graduation Program Examinations Scholarship** of \$1000.00 is awarded to a student who achieves 86 percent or higher on three grade 12 provincial examinations (English 12 may be included) and achieves an overall average of at least a B in English 12. *No need to apply; the Ministry of Education will contact the student should he or she meet the requirements for this scholarship.*

### **Dogwood District/Authority Awards (District Scholarship Program)**

These \$1000 scholarships are awarded to graduating students who meet the criteria determined by the local District Scholarship Committee, which requires a student to demonstrate superior achievement in any of the following areas:

1. Fine Arts (Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
2. Applied Skills (Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
3. Physical Activity (not limited to Physical Education)
4. Second Languages (including Aboriginal Languages with IRP's or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses)

An equitable distribution should be made across the four areas (at the district level). Committee criteria must ensure that the winning candidates have been cumulatively evaluated in the courses chosen for presentation to the committee and satisfy other criteria which may include factors such as attendance, punctuality, work habits and cooperation. The number of Dogwood District/Authority Awards available to Clearwater Secondary School varies from year to year depending on the number of graduating students in each year (usually two). The deadline for submission of the application package is Friday, April 29, 2011. *Use the designated application package for these awards found on the CSS website under **Students>Post Secondary>Awards.***

### **Kamloops Thompson School District #73 Scholarship and Bursary Awards (District Scholarship Program)**

These district-wide awards are located on the School District No. 73 AMAS Awards and Scholarships website: <http://www.sd73.bc.ca/amas/> Enter *Select Value* under School and *district* under Company/Society Name. Most district awards are decided by a committee made up of all school counsellors. *Use the designated application package for these awards found with the award description or on the CSS website under **Students>Post Secondary>Awards.*** The deadline for submission of the application package is April 29, 2011. Each award will have its own application criteria. Applicants are competing with all students at the district level for these awards; the average percentage marks of applicants are generally high (low to high 90's is typical for scholarships; high 80's to low 90's is typical for bursaries).

**Note:** Students must have a *minimum* of four provincially examinable courses (including English 12) to be eligible for district awards; provincial exams do not need to be written for these courses (with the exception of English 12). Most students who apply for district awards have taken at least five provincially examinable courses (six to seven is not uncommon especially for scholarships).

## **E) CSS Awards Application Procedure**

1. Complete a **cover page**. Print off and complete the second to last page of this booklet. Check off the awards for which you've applied.

2. Word-process a general **letter of application** to:

This one-page letter should begin with an introduction of the applicant. This should include name, career goal, where the applicant intends to enrol for post-secondary education, whether the applicant has been conditionally admitted to the program of study, and when their program will commence. Sign your letter. *See next page for sample cover letter.*

3. Complete a **School and Community Involvement Chart** (print last page of booklet). In addition, students may include a one-page resume that highlights their accomplishments, activities, and experiences.

4. Include **one letter of reference** from teachers, employers coaches, and/or community members. Note: Some awards require two letters of reference (i.e. Blazers; two reference letters requirement indicated on Blazers application form)

5. Attach current **school transcript of grades** (obtain from secretary Ms. Bryant). Highlight the eight courses and associated classroom/school marks (without provincial exam factored in) to be used toward your average percentage mark. Include **third term** (midterm) **report card** for any second semester courses you wish to count toward your average percentage mark. Highlight these courses/marks.

6. Address eligibility for each award on a separate sheet of paper. After the number and name of each award, the applicant must state, in **paragraph** form, why he or she is eligible for the award. Some awards have specific criteria (association membership/affiliation, parent's workplace, composition etc.); this information must be included in the application. For **bursaries**, be sure to describe your financial need. You do not need to indicate your family income, but you should describe economic hardships and anticipated expenses. Applicants may apply for as many awards as they feel qualified.

7. Include additional **application forms** if needed (available from the counselling office).

**Photo-copy (one-side only) CSS Awards Application package three times. Do not staple your package; use a paper clip or a clear folder to secure pages. Submit your original and copied packages (four in total) to the counselling office.**

The contact person for applying for the Bursary or Scholarship is the Patricia Persad from the Counselling Office at Clearwater Secondary School unless otherwise specified.

The closing date for all Clearwater Secondary School Awards is **Friday, April 29, 2011 at 9:00 A.M. sharp.** Late applications will not be accepted. Some scholarships and bursaries may have their own specific closing dates (i.e. TRU Board of Governors Regional High School Entrance Scholarship closing date is Feb. 21, 2011). For CSS students, the District Awards deadline is also April 29, 2011.

## **G) CSS Award Descriptions, Amount, and Specific Criteria**

- 1. Xi Epsilon Eta/Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi**  
**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** To be awarded to a student of Clearwater Secondary School/Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better) who is continuing into post secondary education. Preference may be given to a son or daughter of Beta Sigma Phi member. The student must begin the education program within two years of graduation. This award is payable upon successful completion of a first semester with proof of enrolment in a second semester. This application must be submitted within six months of completing the first semester. Students must list school and outside activities, along with organization's names, in which you have participated. If you are working part-time while attending school provide details.  
**Amount of Award: \$250.00 (RECIPIENT SELECTED BY DONOR)**
- 2. Bill Sedgwick Memorial Bursary /Upper North Thompson Stock Association**  
**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** Awarded to a student going onto technical, vocational, college or university with preference given to a student coming from an agricultural background such as a family member of an U.N.T.L.A. member, a 4-H member or a student entering the field of agriculture.  
**Amount of Award: \$250.00**
- 3. B.O.P. Elks #499 Scholarship**  
**Type of Award:** Scholarship  
**Description of Award:** For a student entering vocational or technical school.

Funds may be given only when the students have forwarded to the School Board Office proof of registration at the relevant institutions.

**Description of Award:** Awarded to a graduate of the Clearwater Secondary School/Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better) who is continuing into post secondary education. **Amount of Award: \$500.00**

**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** Awarded to a graduate of the Clearwater Secondary School/Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better) who is continuing into post secondary education. The student will have demonstrated community service, citizenship,

and leadership. The student must begin the educational program within two years of graduation. The award is payable upon successful completion of a first semester with proof of enrolment in a second semester.

**8. Central North Thompson Rod and Gun Club Bursary**

**Type of Award:** Bursary

**Description of Award:** To be awarded to deserving graduates with good average grades (C+ or better) who are continuing into post-secondary education. First preference will be given to students pursuing careers in the fields of forestry, fisheries, or conservation. Second preference will be given to students who have been involved with conservation in the Central North Thompson area. Bursaries may be deferred up to one year. Bursaries will be paid upon proof of completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and registration in second semester.

**Amount of Award: 2 x \$500.00 (RECIPIENTS SELECTED BY DONOR)**

**9. Dr. Helmcken Memorial Hospital Health Care Auxiliary Bursary**

**Type of Award:** Bursary

**Description of Award:** Dr. Helmcken Memorial Hospital Health Care Auxiliary present this award to a graduating student of CSS who is registered in a post-secondary institution in the medical, hospital, or health related fields. **The applicant must complete application form (obtain from counselling office), which requires a handwritten letter.** The award is payable only after proof of first successfully completing the first semester and enrolling in a second semester.

**10. Fund for a Worthy Student**

**Type of Award:** Bursary

**Description of Award:** To a deserving student entering post-secondary education.

**Amount of Award: \$500.00**

**11. Kamloops Blazers High School Scholarship**

**Type of Award:** Scholarship

**Description of Award:** To be awarded to a student who is highly involved in community/school activities, participates in athletics, and maintains a reasonable academic standing (minimum 2.5 G.P.A. or C+). Applicant must be going on to post-secondary education (trades, technical, or academic). **The applicant must complete application form (obtain from counselling office).** Proof of registration required for disbursement of award.

**Amount of Award: \$1000.00**

**12. KTTA-Bert Lambert Memorial Scholarship**

**Type of Award:** Scholarship

**Description of Award:** Kamloops/Thompson Teachers Association Scholarships are awarded to students planning a career in an education-related field. **Interview required.**

**13. Dr. Cary Lam Memorial Scholarship**

**Type of Award:** Scholarship

**Description of Award:** Awarded to a student who is intending to pursue further studies in a medical field. The student should also have exemplified a spirit of social consciousness and community commitment.

**Amount of Award: \$1000.00**

**14. Principals and Vice-Principals' Bursary**

**Type of Award:** Bursary

**Description of Award:** For a student going on to post-secondary education.

**Amount of Award: \$500.00 (RECIPIENT SELECTED BY DONOR)**

- 15. Royal Canadian Legion Branch #259 Bursary**  
**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** Must be a child, grandchild, or great grandchild of a veteran of the Canadian Armed Services. Applicants must provide proof of registration in a full-time program at an established college, institution, or university, or proof of further development in their field under formal instruction. Award must be used within one year of date given. Students must explain their financial need in their application. **The applicant must complete application form (obtain from counselling office). Interview required.**  
**Amount of Award: \$1000.00 (RECIPIENT SELECTED BY DONOR)**
- 16. Safety Mart/M.W. Sharke Contracting Scholarship**  
**Type of Award:** Scholarship  
**Description of Award:** For a deserving student going on to post-secondary education or trades program. Preference given to a son/daughter of either of these two companies' employees or student employees. The award is payable only after proof of completion of first semester and registration in second semester.  
**Amount of Award: \$1000.00 (RECIPIENT SELECTED BY DONOR)**
- 17. Canadian Forest Products Ltd./Vavenby Division of Independent Truckers: Wayne Strobbe Memorial Bursary**  
**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** To deserving students of C.S.S. Pursuing any post-secondary education. For both bursaries the recipient will be the child or legal dependent of a Canadian Forest Products employee or a Canfor contractor. Proof of registration within three years will be required to attain the bursary cheque.  
**Amount of Award: 2 x \$1000.00 (RECIPIENTS SELECTED BY DONOR)**

**Description of Award:** A student who demonstrates initiative, dedication and community spirit.

**Type of Award:** Scholarship  
**Description of Award:** To be awarded to an outstanding and well-rounded graduate of CSS with at least a B+ (80 percent) average who is entering Thompson Rivers University. For the purpose of determining the recipient of this award, academic achievement will be weighted 60 percent and school and community involvement 40 percent. As per TRU guidelines, marks for five grade 11 courses will be used to determine average percentage mark: English 11, Principles of Math 11, Social Studies 11, Science 11 (top), and top grade 11 academic elective. Follow CSS School Awards application procedure.  
Note: TRU has clarified there is no guarantee that a CSS grad will receive this award.  
**Amount of Award: Tuition waiver for two semesters and lab fee waiver up to a maximum of \$3,000.00 (Deadline: Feb. 21, 2011) (RECIPIENT NOMINATED BY CLEARWATER SECONDARY AWARDS COMMITTEE BUT SELECTED BY DONOR)**
- 20. Interior Savings Credit Union Bursary**  
**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** For a student graduating from high school who is registering full-time in a degree, diploma, or trade certification program at a recognized post-secondary institution. Students must exhibit financial need, good character and potential for their chosen field. Students must be members of Interior Savings, and in good standing, for at least one year prior to application. Students whose parents are employed by ISCU or its subsidiary companies are eligible for our bursaries through this program. Bursaries will be paid upon proof of full-time registration for post-secondary education. Bursaries are valid until December 1<sup>st</sup> of year issued, but may be deferred for an additional year upon written request.

Proof of registration must be shown to C&DMHA treasurer.  
**Amount of Award: 2 x \$500.00 (RECIPIENTS SELECTED BY DONOR)**

**Type of Award:** Bursary  
**Description of Award:** Open to all students; however, preference will be given to a student entering Field of Forestry, Wood Related Fields or Agriculture. Donor requests that the recipient write **a follow-up letter** within six months of starting post-secondary education describing his or her field of study and experience to date in that field.

Upon proof of registration in university, the money will be dispersed.
