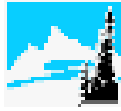

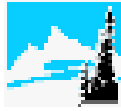

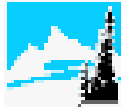

Award Types

Scholarship

The term **scholarship** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. Recipients are normally chosen on the basis of their **academic achievement**; however, other factors may include specific criteria as set out by the donor such as program of study, location of university or college and type or number of completed courses used in the calculation of the student's academic average. Applicants must be aware that these factors vary from donor to donor and award to award and that donors reserve the right to set their criteria as they see fit. *In many cases, donors consider factors such as the student's community involvement and volunteer or service activities as well as their academic achievement.* Normally, the criteria is specifically stated in advance under the description of the award. The amount of the award may also vary from year to year depending on the donor's financial situation.

Bursary

The term **bursary** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. The demonstrated **financial need** of the applicant is a significant factor in the selection of the recipient. *As with scholarships, other factors may include academic achievement, career goals, extra-curricular involvement and community service. Because bursaries prioritize financial need, applicants are required to complete the Bursary Awards Application—Financial Need Section.* This information is treated as sensitive and confidential.

Clearwater Secondary School Scholarships & Bursary Awards Selection Committee

The **Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee** is typically chaired by the School Counsellor and is comprised of the School Principal and/or Vice-Principal, a community representative who is normally the current or a past School District Trustee for Clearwater, and/or a Teacher Representative. This committee reviews applications for scholarships and bursaries that are *not* selected by donors and selects recipients on behalf of donors.

Those scholarships and bursaries whose recipients are selected by the donor are identified in the descriptions.

Average Percentage Mark

For the purposes of selecting award recipients, the Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee will use the following **formula** to determine the academic standing of applicants. The **average percentage mark** is based on

- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the five required courses in grades 11 and 12** (Language Arts 11, Mathematics 11, Social Studies 11 or First Nations Studies 12, (the top) Science 11, and Language Arts 12)
plus
- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the applicant's top three grade 12 numbered courses.**

Note: The completion of Essentials or Apprenticeship and Workplace Mathematics and Communications courses will not exclude a student from being eligible for most awards. Some school awards are inclusive in nature and donors encourage all students to apply for them. The TRU Board of Governors' Regional High School Entrance Scholarship is an exception and requires more academic courses.

Note: It is difficult to identify courses as academic and non-academic. For this reason, the Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee will consider most grade 12 courses equally. It is in the best interest of the student to complete as many grade 12 courses as possible in order to augment the average percentage mark.

- For the purpose of determining the **average percentage mark, the following courses will not be considered:** Work Experience 12A or 12B, Secondary School Apprenticeship 12A or 12B, Teacher Assistant 12, Independent Directed Study 12, Learning Strategies 12, or External Credentials.
- Marks from regular courses taken second semester may be counted toward your average percentage mark. The courses will be indicated on your Transcript Verification Report (TVR). Obtain end of Term 3 mark from your teacher and ask your teacher to initial grade on *Grades Submission Section* of application form.

- Distance Learning courses (@KOOL) must be at least three-quarters completed (75+ percent) by the end of the third term to be considered in the average percentage mark.
- TRU>Start Open Learning dual credit courses must be fully completed and have been assigned a final mark by the time of application to be considered in the average percentage mark.

Note: The eight courses used to determine the average percentage mark **constitute the minimum level of course work necessary** in order for students to be considered for scholarships or bursaries in a given year. The percentages of these eight courses will be added together and divided by eight to establish an **average percentage mark**. This average percentage mark shall be used to rank all applicants in order to determine the top academic students from Clearwater Secondary School.

Graduation Program Examinations Scholarships

History: As a result of the cancellation of optional provincial examinations, the Provincial Scholarship Program has been revised. Graduation Program Examinations Scholarships will be awarded based on students’ performance on the Graduation Program Exams. These revisions are intended to recognize students’ academic excellence across the suite of graduation provincial exams.

Purpose: The Graduation Program Examinations Scholarships reward graduating students in BC for academic excellence in their provincial examinations from grades 10 to 12. Scholarships are intended to assist in tuition for furthering a student’s post-secondary education. The Ministry will grant \$1000 and \$2500 (for top twenty scholarship students province-wide) scholarships based on BC provincial exam results to those students who meet established criteria.

Criteria: For students graduating on or after September 1, 2011, the following rules apply:

- Students must achieve at least a “B” (73% or above) final mark (provincial exam and school mark combined) in one of the Language Arts 12 (Communications 12, English 12, Francais langue premiere 12, or English 12 First Peoples).
- Students must achieve at least one “A” (86% or higher) and three “B”s (73% or higher) on four of their best provincial exams (can include the Language Arts 12 provincial exam).
- The examination rewrite rule will be relaxed for one year (September 1, 2011 to August 31, 2012) to allow students to rewrite a required exam to improve their scores. *Please see Mr. or Mrs. Persad for the Provincial Examination Schedule and to set up a rewrite session.*

- **This scholarship (in the form of a voucher) is automatically generated by the Ministry of Education. No application is required.**

Passport to Education Program

The Grade 10 and Grade 11 awards are worth \$250 each. The Grade 12 award is worth \$500. These are awarded to students according to Ministry of Education guidelines and the individual school's criteria, which may include academic achievement, demonstrations of citizenship and social responsibility, and school and/or community service.

At Clearwater Secondary School, academic standing is the primary consideration. **This scholarship (in the form of a stamp in a small passport or booklet) is automatically generated by the Ministry of Education. No application is required.** The number of stamps provided to each school is based on the number of students attending and, thus, varies from year to year. It is possible for a student to be awarded a stamp in one grade and not in other grades. Notification Letters are mailed to recipients in late summer or early fall. Graduates or their parents may obtain and sign for passports at the Main Office of Clearwater Secondary School once notified by mail.

Dogwood District/Authority Awards

These \$1000 scholarships are awarded to graduating students who meet the criteria determined by the local School District Scholarship Committee, which requires a student to demonstrate superior achievement in any of the following areas:

1. Fine Arts (Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
2. Applied Skills (Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
3. Physical Activity (not limited to Physical Education)
4. Second Languages (including Aboriginal Languages with IRP's or External Assessments, including AP/IB courses)

An equitable distribution should be made across the four areas (at the district level). Committee criteria must ensure that the winning candidates have been cumulatively evaluated in the courses chosen for presentation to the committee and satisfy other criteria which may include factors such as attendance, punctuality, work habits and cooperation. The number of Dogwood District/Authority Awards available to Clearwater Secondary School varies from year to year depending on the number of graduating students in each year (usually two). The deadline for submission of the application package to Main Office is May 1st. Use the designated Dogwood Application package for these awards found on the CSS website under **Students>Post Secondary>Awards**. Submit in a separate envelope.

Kamloops Thompson School District #73 Scholarship and Bursary Awards

These district-wide awards are located and usually updated in the spring on the School District No. 73 AMAS Awards and Scholarships website. See link to AMAS: <http://www3.sd73.bc.ca/general/content/awards-and-scholarships>. Most district awards are decided by a committee made up of school counsellors. **Note:** Our application package is modelled on the district application package to make it easier to apply to both school and district awards. Each district award will have its own application criteria. Applicants are competing with all students at the district level for these awards; the average percentage marks of applicants are generally high (mid to high 90's is typical for scholarships; high 80's to low 90's is typical for bursaries). The deadline for submission of the application package to the Main Office is May 1st. Use the designated District #73 Application package for these awards found on the CSS website under **Students>Post Secondary>Awards**. Submit in a separate envelope.

Open Scholarship and Bursary Awards

Open scholarships and bursary awards are open to students across British Columbia, Canada, and/or the world. Open awards have varied deadlines, criteria, and submission requirements. - awarded to a student going onto technical, vocational, college or university
- preference given to a student with an agricultural background
- preference given to a family member of U.N.T.L.A. or to a 4-H member or to a student entering the field of agriculture

B.O.P. Elks #499 Bursary: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a student entering vocational or technical school

Canadian Forest Products Ltd. / Vavenby Division of Independent Truckers: Wayne Strobbe Memorial Bursary: 2 @ \$1000

- awarded to deserving graduates of Clearwater Secondary School
- recipient will be a child or legal dependent of a Canadian Forest Products employee or a Canfor contractor

- awarded to a graduate of Clearwater Secondary School / Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better)

- student must begin post-secondary education program within two years of graduation
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrollment in second semester
